Continuous enrollment

Over the last 14 years, we have built a reputable name for our selves and have proved to be a credible and reliable institution of learning. We have established a clientele so broad it spreads across the nation and goes beyond our boarders.

However, we still have room for further expansion. We have school places from Baby class to grade seven at our Primary section, and from grade eight to grade twelve at

Academic Standards

One of our major aspirations on academics is to see learning reflected in both achievement and growth. Therefore, we have continued revising our teaching and learning policies to ably meet the standards of modern teaching and learning.

We have structured our termly assessments in a series of three standardized monthly tests across the subjects. The first and second tests are marked out of 20 marks each, while the end of term tests are scored out of 60 marks. This continuous assessment kind of grading persuades the pupils to aim at scoring highly in all the three tests.


Mock and Mid-year Exams

We have just concluded our mock and mid year exams in which all pupils took part. Teachers are now marking and writing progress reports. We appeal to you to come through on open day and collect you child's progress report card and talk to the teachers.

Open day/ Opening day

On Monday 4th September, we will have an open day starting at 08:00hrs to 16:30hrs. This event will be held in our main dining hall. We urge you to make every effort to come and talk to the teachers about your child's weaknesses and strengths.

The afore mentioned date will also be the day borders are expected to report back and the following day will, full time teaching and learning will start.



Pupils school requirements

We wish to remind all our parents and guardians that as your child is being brought back next term, please see to it that they report with the appropriate requirements as stipulated on the requirement's list. Pupils with less requirements will not be checked in and those with more in number than what has been specified will have the excess items either sent back home or confiscated.

Library

The school has a fully functional library that complements and offers reference to what is taught in the classroom. We have a qualified full time librarian who gives handy guidance to the pupils and all other library users.

To provide our learners with latest information, we purchased 128 recently published text books for the O level and IGCSE syllabi. In addition, we also restocked the fiction shelf with new novels. We believe this will motivate the pupils to spend more time in the library.

We have experienced a spate of thefts of our school books in the recent past and as a result, we have installed CCTV cameras in the library to enhance security of the books.

In case you find your child in possession of a school book, please advise them to bring it back to the school as we do not lend out library books during recess.

We further request the parents who have books they may donate to the school to come through and make a donation.

DDADS

DDADS is an acronym coined from the phrase 'Demand Driven Academic Delivery System'. This is a policy we have formulated to create order and responsibility in the demands and delivery of services, by all stake holders in the school including parents. The order of demands begins with the least on the ladder of hierarchy; the students. Next, is the general teaching staff, then the school management and we have the directors. At the very top of the hierarchy order , is you the parents. This system has a band of demands each of the stake holders expect and are expected of from those above them and those below them. One has to fully exhaust all the higher authority before the demands are presented to the highest authorities, in this case who are the parents.

So, the next time your child presents concerns that can only be sorted out by the school management, inquire from them if at all they have presented their issue with the school management.

Non-academic Book Reading Program

This term, we ran a compulsory reading program in which every student in school was expected to read not less than one book. This exercise was very successful in that it allowed first time readers to read and finish a novel within a week or two.

Athletics

Chalo Trust School has been fairing extremely well in the sports discipline. Even though many of the schools we compete against have been in existence way longer than we have, we win most of the competitions at ISAZ interschools level. Where we fail to get the first position, we emerge second.

Early this term, we had our local inter-house Athletics competition and we later participated in the ISAZ Midland Athletics competition at Olympic Development Centre (OYDC) in Lusaka. We rivalled against schools like American International School of Lusaka (AISL), Baobab College, International school of Lusaka (ISL), Mary Queen of Peace, Rhodes Park School, Ibex Hill School and Banani. Chalo Trust School came out second, thanks to our gallant boys and girls who really deserved an accolade for the colourful performance they always put up.

We also took part in the ISAZ National Sports competition at (OYDC) on 10th June 2017. Chengelo, Amano, Lechwe, Mpelembe, Simba, Trident College, Ndola Trust were among the schools that took part.

The Copperbelt region got the first position while the Lusaka schools were in second place. However, as Chalo Trust School our participants obtained (28) medals; (2)two Gold, (18)eighteen Silver and (8)eight Bronze.

We will keep on supporting our pupils in this faculty and continue to urge them to put in their best.

Pastoral care and Counselling

The Pastoral care in our school exists with the sole purpose of helping pupils with spiritual, personal and sometimes academic performance challenges. We have a full time, qualified School Chaplain who heads this program. Regardless of ones social back ground, teenagers usually grapple with various matters of challenge and we are glad that some of those are being addressed during this program. We get so many testimonies of how this program has been of great help to most of them.

Daily Devotions

One of the good habits we have always strived to inculcate in our pupils is to start and end their day with a prayer. We have morning devotions that are conducted under the supervision of house parents in the hostels before the students go for breakfast. We also have the evening devotions that are held just after the end of the evening prep. These spiritual meeting have impacted the students lives greatly, such that they learn to say a prayer and share from the scriptures.

Sunday Chapel

Being a Christian boarding school, we conduct Sunday chapel services every Sunday morning for the students. These services are held in the dining hall at 09:00hrs. The services are inter-denominational in nature and therefore compulsory to all pupils. The School Chaplain is the main preacher, however, we invite a few other preachers who preach to the pupils the undiluted gospel of salvation through Jesus Christ, and help to grow their Christian faith.

Parents should make sure their children pack the appropriate Sunday attires to avoid being inconvenienced or even punished whenever, they show up for fellowship in a wrong dress code; smart wear for boys and long and decent skirts for girls.

Primary Section Handwriting competition

The Primary Section undertook this program at the beginning of this term, on 12th May, 2017. This competition was aimed at building the learners' handwriting style and developing a long lasting good handwriting. We drew participants from Pre-school to Grade seven. Pupils were taught how to hold a pen or pencil, how to form and join letters, and how to do spacing in between words.

Those with the best handwriting were announced as winners and were awarded.

2017 Talent Show

Saturday July 15th was the day our talented boys and girls show cased their various talents before the parents and everyone present.

Vocal and instrumental music pieces from individuals and group performance were among the presented items that afternoon. Other showcased pieces of entertainment were dancing, rapping, modelling, cooking and gymnastics.

The group called leaders of tomorrow crowned the event with an immensely moving poem of an orphaned child crying for help. It was simply an eventful afternoon.

Pupils must always be encourage to explore their talents and use such platforms to develop and perfect them. We will do our best to help them excel in non academically inclined virtues like talent.

Motivational Talk

After noticing bits of lethargy towards academics in our students, we organised a Motivational Talk on the topic "The importance of Science and Mathematics in school." This was held on 17th May 2017 in the school's main assembly hall. We had a group of four presenters from the Engineering Institute of Zambia lead by Engineer Chama Chilomo. Engineer Mathews Saili the Vice President of the Engineering Institute of Zambia was also in attendance. They addressed the discovery and history of Science and Mathematics, and the importance of studying these subjects. They further discussed the associated careers like Mechanical, Electrical and Civil Engineering and the various formulas used in these disciplines. Pupils expressed a lot interest in the subjects under discussion, especially when they learned that some engineers in the group of presenters were the ones that planned some of the beautiful buildings in Lusaka. They asked many questions which were ably answered by the presenters.
